

REGULARLY SCHEDULED COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

JUNE 21, 2010

The regularly scheduled council meeting was held on the above date at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. The next item on the agenda was the Mayor’s City Address. Mayor Lewis gave a rundown of how the city has progressed within the last year. Some of the topics that were highlighted was monies received from the Brushy Fork Grant in the amount of ten thousand dollars the money was used for a study on the Bert T. Combs Lake. Money was also received through ATF for forfeiture money in the amount of thirteen thousand dollars. The Department of Fish and Wildlife worked with the city to get a handicapped accessible boat dock at the Bert T. Combs Lake at no cost to the city. Mayor Lewis also added in the address that the city had worked with the county to get water to an additional eighty five residents in the county with county and state funding. Some of the other items included community gardens, Track and Field Day with Get Moving Manchester participation, and that the City of Manchester will be listed in the Guinness Book of World Records for the horse ride that took place at the equestrian trail at Beech Creek. Mayor Lewis went on to mention the amounts of revenues that the city has received in the last year along with the grants the city has been involved with.

The next item on the agenda was the announcement of the ten thousand dollar grant that was received through Brushy Fork that will be used for picnic areas around the Bert T. Combs Lake, one hundred thousand dollars in ATF forfeiture money, and also community camps that have been assisted by Deputy Clerk Agnes Jewell.

Mayor Lewis read a letter from Jane Higgins, with the Brushy Fork Institute, approving the grant. Jane also sent another letter congratulating the city on the horse trail ride.

Mayor Lewis informed the council of the summer employment of fourteen workers with the help of Joanne Nolan and others at Daniel Boone Community Action Agency. Mayor Lewis informed everyone that they workers can work with at the city for no cost to the city for up to

ten and a half weeks; also the city has three drug court participants volunteering as well. Mayor Lewis informed every one of some of the things that the summer workers have been doing since they have been working for the city which included; cleaning out ditches, painting street signs, working on sewer problems, and painting fire hydrants.

The next item on the agenda was the Bravo Company newsletter that was handed out to everyone. The Bravo Company is an adopted unit of the city's that is across seas right now in Afghanistan, in the news letter they thanked the City of Manchester for the box sent to them.

The next item on the agenda was updates of what the city is working on read aloud by Mayor Lewis. Items mentioned where; the Muddy Gap sewer project that will begin in September, Pennington Hill tank project will begin in September as well, black topping for city streets to go to bid within the next week, CDBG funds, Summerfest, sportsman's event in October, horse ride set for Fall, business licenses renewal being sent out by Pam Mathis, delinquent property taxes being worked on by Agnes Jewell, new accounting procedures done by Agnes Jewell, Rhonda Benge, and Sarah Salmons, health insurance deductibles for employees, painting of the new water plant, advertising on I-75 and Hal Rogers Parkway, Cumberland Valley ADD housing grants, and movies in the park and campground.

The next item on the agenda was brought before the council by Councilmember John Ed Pennington was an issue on Wayne Street with a huge pot hole. Also Councilmember John Ed Pennington informed every one of the stop sign in front of George Saylor's house on Wayne Street is crooked, some employees was over there working on it and made it worse. Councilmember John Ed Pennington also informed everyone that the four way stop on Green Street needs to be enforced.



The council and mayor will be going on a tour of Y-Hollow on Thursday at 8:15 a.m.


